
















Leads to a Community of Changemakers



In 2022 we created our inaugural Student Advisory Board. Our youth board consists of 14 devoted kids, dedicated to making a strong impact. The members range in age of ten to fourteen. Through this experience these future leaders are growing in understanding areas of need in our community and benefiting from education in project management, budget management, fundraising, public speaking and the impact of kindness.

The Power of Helping Others!

Our **Pack-A-Snack** program is our flagship volunteer program and currently serves 215 students weekly, in Pinellas Co. Our volunteers deliver bags to 6 local schools each week for packages to be sent home on the weekends. Each bag contains 10 food items including milk, juice, breakfast items, fruit cups, snacks and protein.

This program serves as our largest Kindness Project as it is designed to serve the most in our community at one time and it provides the best experience for families of all ages to join in giving back and making an impact.

Nearly 40% of children in Pinellas Co. live in a home that is struggling to meet basic needs.* Holiday celebrations in these homes can carry an added burden or in some cases, seem nearly impossible.


In December 2024, Lotz of Blessings hosted its first Merry Market, an event designed to provide families seeking additional holiday support with a dignified and joyful holiday shopping experience.

At the Merry Market, parents facing financial hardships were able to purchase gifts for their children at up to 90% off retail prices, allowing them to share the joy of giving while maintaining their pride. We are particularly excited to have served those in the often-overlooked 12-18 age group.

In addition to the gifts and shopping experience we curated, over 50% of our volunteers were under the age of 18. All proceeds will be reinvested to sustain this event on an annual basis and we look forward to our 2025 Merry Market!







Fundraising

Our organization is sustained through personal donations, of which all monies are redistributed into our community through service projects.

One-time donations and **sustaining supporters** are instrumental to our success and the impact of a recurring monthly donation at even \$25 can grow and sustain our programs.

We partner with **community advocacy clubs** that often provide small grants to assist with our program and we are seeking **corporate partnerships** to support future growth.

In-kind donations from community members are always welcome and support our food programs in significant ways, no gift is too small.

We have also incorporated two main fundraising events, our annual **Be the Glow Color Run** which includes peer-to-peer fundraising and our **Spring Tea Party** to support our summer of kindness program.
